



Celebrate ***RED RIBBON WEEK*** October 19 –23, 2009

Red Ribbon Week is a time for the students, their families and our schools to show their stand against drugs. Red Ribbon Week focuses on students making healthy choices, especially the choices to avoid drugs. Each day of the week, the students will have a different activity to remind them to make the right choice and to stay drug free.

MONDAY, OCTOBER 19:

The youngest and only child of each family will bring home a ***red ribbon*** to tie on their home mailbox or tree.

Friendship bracelets and pencils will be distributed to each student. Encourage your children to wear their “Red Ribbon Week” bracelets all week.

TUESDAY OCTOBER 20:

“White Eagle Goes Red.” Students wear as much red clothing as possible.

WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 21:

“We CAN Make a Difference.” Bring in a can of food at drop off time to donate to the local Green Harvest Food Pantry <http://www.greenharvest.org/>. All canned goods are welcome, but at this time, there is a particular need for items for school lunches such as applesauce, pudding cups, juice boxes and fruit. Other needed non-perishable food items include Chicken and Tuna Helper, muffin mixes (corn blueberry etc.), and chili.

“Put a Cap on Drugs” Day. Have your children wear a cap or interesting hat to school.

THURSDAY, OCTOBER 22:

“Being Drug Free is No Sweat” Day. Students celebrate Red Ribbon Week by wearing sweatshirts, sweat pants or sweat suits.

FRIDAY, OCTOBER 23:

“Team-Up Against Drugs.” Students wear their favorite team jersey.
